Căluș as a ritual

- functions: healing, protecting from Rusalii, bringing fertility to the households, initiation
- participants: vătaf, călușari, stegar, ajutor de vătaf (primul călușar), mut
- clothing: festive clothing, some special elements
- regions: Oltenia (Calus Oltenesc) mainly, Moldova, Transilvania
- time: in the villages starts on Saturday (Sîmbăta Rusaliilor), Pentecost and Monday of the Holy Spirit (Rusalii), the week between Pentecost and the Sunday of All Saints
- other attributes: clubs/ wooden swords; bells and spurs; bete (two belts) (see also Firică 2010: 7-8); garlic and wormwood; red wooden phallus; 'cioc' / 'iepure' (an item of rabbit's skin) sometimes instead of 'mut'
- **ritual:** 1) preparation; 2) taking the oath and rising the flag (rite of passage); 3) going from house to house; 4) burying the flag in conjunction with the dissolution of the group (Kligman 1981: 13)
- music: in past two bagpipers, now: violin, clarinet or/and accordion

Alaiul Călușului Oltenesc in Craiova (observations)

- the Căluș dance is in the center of the performances
 - "Jocul căluș<mark>ar</mark>ilor este unul dintre cele mai spectaculoase dansuri populare românesti" (The play of calusari is one of the most spectacular Romanian folk dances)
- beliefs and superstitions still exist



24 January: Union Day/Small Union (*Unirea Principatelor Româane / Mica Unire*)

April/May: Easter (Paștele)

1 May: Labour Day (Ziua Muncii)

1 June: Children's Day (Ziua Copilului)

May/June: Pentecost (Rusaliile)

15 August: Dormition of the Theotokos (Adormirea Maicii Domnului / Sfânta

Maria Mare)

30 November: St. Andrew's Day (Sfântul Andrei)

1 December: National Day/Great Union (Ziua Națională / Marea Unire)

25 and 26 December: Christmas (Crăciunul)
